## Storm continues unbeaten

The Airdrie Storm is on a roll.

The bantam football team, which is only in its second season, walked all over the Stampeders at Mewata Stadium Saturday.

The Storm cleaned the Stampeders clock, dancing away with a 24-0 win, leaving the Storm and the Bulldogs as the only unbeaten teams in the bantam league this year.

"The weekend went just great," said Storm coach Jeff Younger. "The game was never in doubt."

The Storm started things off with a 10-play drive from the opening kickoff, culminating in a three-yard touchdown run by Jon Jennings.

The Storm failed to convert, a pattern played out again and again during the game.

The next score came in the second quarter, on a seven-yard pass from Tyrell Rohl to Mike Antonius. After a missed conversion attempt, the score stood at 12-0.

Airdrie again put points up on the board with a spectacular pass-and-run from Rohl to B.J. Jagdath to set the Storm up on the Stampeders' five-yard line.

Jennings carried the ball over for six in the last play of the first half.

punt for the first time in the second half, but a 21-yard run by Antonius brought in another TD and the final score of the game.

"It was another game of total domination," Younger said of his squad's efforts. "Offensively, we shut them down for a total offensive yardage of 37 yards.

"Our defence just played one heck of a game," he added.

Offensively, Jennings

had 10 carries for 57 yards and two TDs. Antonius notched up 13 carries for 57 yards and one touchdown and four receptions for 51 yards and one TD.

Jagdath had one reception for 29 yards.

Rohl had an excellent game, completing six of seven passes for 82 yards and one touchdown.

Antonius and Steven Barker had one interception each.

Several players gave

outstanding efforts in two-way positions, Younger said: Antonius, Chris Skerry, Jeff Himmelspeck and Jon Scott.

Younger also credits his coaching staff for its input: defensive coordinator Thomas Rohl and assistant coaches Dave Manley, Jeremy Pollack and Dave Antonius.

The Storm's next game is Friday at 7:30 p.m. against the Golden Hawks.
